Policy on Acceptable Payment Methods

The United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Alabama accepts the following methods of payment to settle filing fees due:

Debtors - Cashier's check or money order

Debtors in Possession - Business check imprinted with DIP, cashier's check, or money order

Attorneys - Attorneys are required to settle charges through Pay.Gov using a debit/credit card. In the occasional instance when an attorney is unable to use a debit/credit card, we will accept a check drawn on the attorney's trust account.

Non-Debtors - Credit/debit card, cashier's check, or money order

Note: The Court does not accept cash

Notice to Customers Making Payment by Check

When you provide a check as payment, you authorize us either to use information from your check to make a one-time electronic fund transfer from your account or to process the payment as a check transaction.

When we use information from your check to make an electronic fund transfer, funds may be withdrawn from your account as soon as the same day we receive your payment, and you will not receive your check back from your financial institution.
