## **ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER**

WHEREAS, at midnight on October 1, 2025, the continuing resolution that funded multiple Departments and independent agencies of the United States of America expired, and appropriations to the Department of Justice and these other federal departments and agencies lapsed,

WHEREAS, since that time no appropriation bill or continuing resolution has been passed that would restore funding,

WHEREAS, absent an appropriation or continuing resolution, Department of Justice attorneys and employees are prohibited from working even on a voluntary basis except in very limited circumstances, including "emergencies involving the safety of human life or the protection of property." 31 U.S.C. § 1342. With limited exceptions, this includes attorneys and other employees in the Civil Division of the United States Attorney's Office for the Middle District of Alabama, and

WHEREAS, absent an appropriation or continuing resolution, employees of other federal Departments and several agencies who may have matters before the Court, with limited exceptions, also are prohibited from working even on a voluntary basis, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. all hearings involving any claim, lien, or other interest of the United States

of America, including its agencies, scheduled for the week of October 1, 2025, and each week thereafter through the conclusion of the week in which the partial government shutdown ceases, are continued and shall be placed on the next appropriate

calendar;

2. all current deadlines in matters involving a claim, lien, or other interest of

the United States of America, including its agencies, shall be extended through and

including October 31, 2025;

3. all adversary proceedings to which the United States of America, including

its agencies, is a party shall be stayed until such time that Congress has restored

appropriations;

4. if funding is not restored by October 31, 2025, at 10:00 a.m., the Civil Chief

of the United States Attorney's office shall notify the Clerk of Court for the United

States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Alabama so such further action may

be taken as is just and proper; and

5. the Civil Chief of the United States Attorney's office shall forthwith notify

the Clerk of Court for the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of

Alabama once appropriations have been restored.
